Note: The map shows publicly or privately funded musical instrument museums and collections which are either independent or appear as departments in larger institutions, e.g. universities, state, regional or municipal museums, or museums with an emphasis on cultural history. Museums devoted to particular musicians, many of which likewise maintain collections of musical instruments, are not included, except for the Handel House in Halle and the Bach House in Eisenach, whose extensive musical instrument collections form a major focus of their exhibition policy. Instead, these museums are shown on the map 'Museums, archives and research institutes focusing on particular musicians'. There also exist further museums that display musical instruments alongside other objects; owing to the generally small size of their collections, they too have been excluded.
